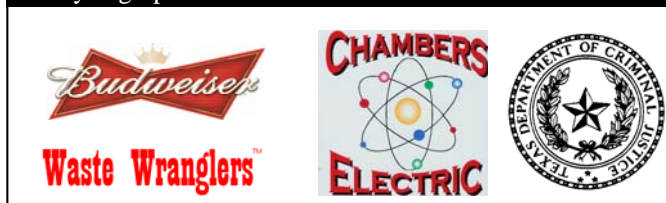

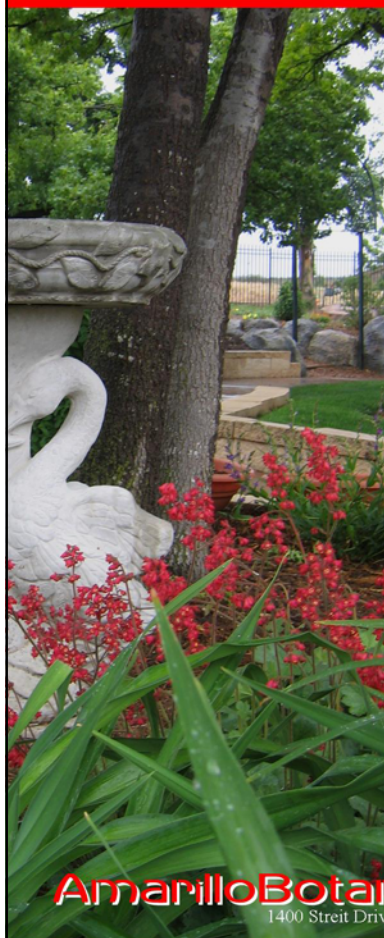

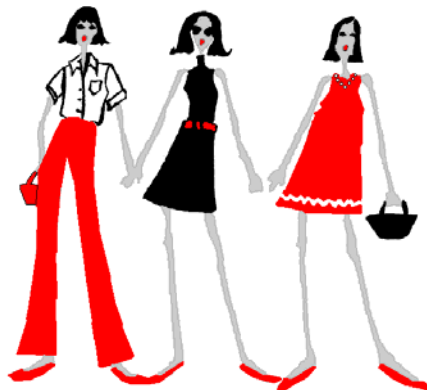

Chamber Board Tours AgriLife Research Center

This month's Chamber Board meeting was held off-site, as the Chamber's Agriculture Council hosted the group at the U.S. Department of Agriculture-Agriculture Research Service and Texas AgriLife Research station near Bushland.

A driving tour introduced board members to research programs by both entities on pathology, entomology, wheat, drip and sprinkler irrigation, weighing lysimeters, evapotranspiration measuring weather stations, dryland conservation terraces, the wind energy and feed yard program.

Following the regular business meeting and lunch (Richard Dyer and Desperado's Catering), the board heard presentations from Dr. Nolan Clark, retired director of the USDA-ARS laboratory; Dr. John Sweeten, resident director for AgriLife Research in Amarillo; and Dr. Terry Howell, acting director of the USDA-ARS laboratory.

Amarillo CVC Nabs Three Awards From State Association

The Amarillo Convention & Visitor Council brought home three awards from the 2009 Annual Conference of the Texas Association of Convention & Visitor Bureaus held in Waco. The awards, all in the large bureau category, were First Place, Web Site; Second Place, Cooperative Marketing; and Judges Award, Convention Marketing.

The Amarillo CVC redesigned and remarketed its web site this year. It's new look, at www.visitamarillotx.com, has been online since a major rollout at the Discovery Center in January 2009.

"Recognition from our peers is very satisfying. The entire CVC staff works very hard to make our site work for all of Amarillo's tourism community. We try to respond to everyone's questions or comments, because a good on-line presence is so important in the tourism industry," Jerry Holt, Vice President of the Amarillo CVC, says.

"Maintaining the Amarillo CVC web site, with more than 300 pages of information, is a team effort. So this award reflects well on the entire CVC staff and our volunteer partners," Patty Bryant, chair of the Amarillo Convention & Visitor Council board, says.

AJR Associates of Spring, TX, helped developed the new CVC site and they have been a great partner on this project from the first day, Holt explains.

More web site improvements are on the way, with a new section for meeting planners, new calendar of events layout, a marketing effort aimed at college football fans visiting the area, and new 360 photos of the Amarillo Civic Center and Amarillo National Center.

Teamed with the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce's award winning web site, this gives the city of Amarillo a great one-two punch in civic on-line promotion.

The Amarillo CVC also won a second-place award for its co-op marketing graphics in several McDonalds in the city. That effort promoted the city as the gateway to Palo Duro Canyon State Park to patrons at five different McDonald's locations.

"McDonald's traffic can run up to 70% from out of town and working with the Dana's (local McDonald's owners) was a pleasure. We hope to work with them again very soon," Holt says.

And the Amarillo CVC's Hunker Down program, to educate locals about bringing conventions and meetings to Amarillo, received a special Judges Award in its category of convention marketing.

"I think all these awards show how dedicated our CVC staff is to all aspects of the tourism and convention industry. Our bottom line is about getting visitors to Amarillo because we know they will have a great time," Gary Molberg, President of the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce, says.

The TACVB is the largest state CVB association in the nation, with members from small towns of 10,000 to large metropolitan cities.

1,000 Wrestlers Head for Amarillo & The Cliff Keen Amarillo Nationals Oct. 30-Nov. 3

Halloween weekend will be filled with more than trick or treaters - it will include take downs, reversals and pins!

A thousand wrestlers, age 15 and under, and more than 2,400 family and fans from 30 states are expected in Amarillo for the first annual Cliff Keen Amarillo Nationals wrestling tournament. All matches will be at the Amarillo Civic Center Cal Farley Coliseum.

This large sports event will add about \$350,000 to Amarillo's economy, from hotels and restaurants to retail business and entertainment.

The Cliff Keen Amarillo Nationals tournament is organized by the World of Wrestling organization from Tulsa, OK. The group has already committed for an event in 2010 and hopes are that the Cliff Keen Amarillo Nationals may become an annual highlight of the Amarillo sports year.

"Landing this large sports event is big news for Amarillo," Jerry Holt, Vice President of the Amarillo Convention & Visitor Council, says. CVC staff made extensive sales calls in the Tulsa area to generate this business but it could not have been completed without the cooperation of the Amarillo Civic Center and Amarillo hotels, he explains.

Age categories include 6 and under; 8 and under; 10 and under, 12 and under and 15 and under with extensive weight divisions in each age category. Wrestling will start on Friday at 5:45 pm and will run all day Saturday. This will be a *Hard Luck Tournament*, guaranteeing each child three matches. If a wrestler loses his first two matches, he goes into a single elimination bracket with medals for 1st and 2nd place. This gives kids more mat time so they improve their wrestling skills.

Other World of Wrestling tournaments are held in Tulsa, Las Vegas, Reno and Charleston, WV.

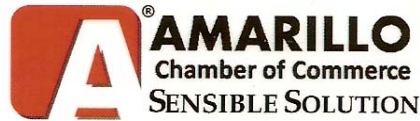
